

Bryan & Crew for entertaining us.





OAHE BOAT RAMP & VOICES FOR LAKE OAHE

At our regular February 7, 2006 meeting, Bis-Man Reel & Rec. decided to join forces with Voices For Lake Oahe. The purpose of this joint venture was to see if something could be done about the lack of river access for boating and bank fishing on the lower part of the Missouri River (formally know as Lake Oahe) north of the South Dakota State line. Also, prevalent at the meeting was the issue of the marginal use of the Hazelton Boat landing.

On February 17, 2006, Rynee Kellar and I traveled to Cattail Bay to attend a meeting with the Voices for Lake Oahe. Mr. Kellar was surprised by the lack of boat access as in 1988 he was a representative from the North Dakota Sport fishing Congress to help gain low water access to the lake. He felt that nothing was accomplished in nearly 18 years. The committee at that time was made up of state agencies and the Corps of Engineers.

As I fish a lot south of Bismarck, I decided to get involved to see if anything can be done to improve the situation. The Bis-Man Reel and Rec., I was made co-chairman of the Oahe boat landing committee and Randy Bosch president of VFLO is the other co-chairman. I am committed to see this project thru with your help.

At the meeting at Cattail, it was decided that we would concentrate our efforts on a road leading to the purpose low water ramp in the Langeliers Bay Area. The present proposed road into the low water ramp may not be usable due to water drainage area from higher elevations. Another location along ND 1804, which starts at a higher elevation and no drainage areas to cross should be considered as an alternate. Both locations may have a conflict with a local land owner, but feel with the right approach, it could be solved.

Our thoughts turned to the Hazelton Boat landing, the sandbar continues to grow southward in front of the boat landing causing it to have marginal use in the last few years. We agree a short term solution would be to have it dredged so it would be usable for the 2006 season. Long term solutions need to be studied to see if the present location should be modified or should be moved further south into the present campground? We believe these two projects above should be put on a list of things that should be accomplished in the near future.

What do we need to do to get the attention of our congressional people to get special funding for these projects?

The Voices for Lake Oahe are currently involved in several major projects

1. Our ongoing efforts to update & develop new temporary boating access at Langeliers Bay and to monitor the existing ramps at Hazelton and Ohlheiser (north Beaver Bay), also our new Jennerville Ramp @ the Rivery. 2. The Voices are also involved in a project to impound water east of Hwy 1804 at Beaver Bay we met with Game and Fish Director Terry Steinwand on 2\24 and hopefully have overcome some of their objections. The next step is a study from The State Water Commission.

We have heard overwhelming positive feedback from our membership and other clubs on the potential of this project.

3. We have been in correspondence with the Corps of Engineers on shoreline access and hope to have some areas available for shore fisherman by spring. Other projects include Scenic Byway status for Highway 1804. Ron Kraft

25th ANNUAL REEL AND REC WALLEYE DERBY It's hard to believe but it's nearly time for spring fishing on the Missouri. This years derby will feature two tournaments in one, similar to the Governor's Cup. The second tourney will be called Boat Ramp and Special Projects Derby, and any monies made will go for just that. The entry fees are in keeping with our philosophy of a family derby, but will also allow you to win more prize money with an additional fee. This years entry fee for the main derby is \$99.00 per team, with a winning prize of \$2000.00. With an additional entry fee of \$60.00 per team for the Boat Ramp and Special Projects Derby the winning prize would be \$3200.00. The application is enclosed for more details. The derby will be held at Graners Bottom on the 20th of May. The drawing for the derby will be April 18th at the Mandan Moose Club. There will be a free keg.
