 $85^{\circ}$  air temperature,  $78^{\circ}$  water temperature and three foot swells greeted the members on Saturday; pretty much ideal conditions for this large, wind-swept natural lake. The reason wind is so important during this part of the year is because of a nasty blue-green algae bloom on the surface of the water which will make you hold your nose if the air is still.

A variety of presentations were employed for the weekend including, but not limited to, cranking, jigging, pitching, bouncing, slipping and finally, live-baiting in shallow(4-8'), medium(8-12'), and deep(12-35') waters.

The adults finally brought more weight to the scales than the kids on Saturday for a change! The club provided hamburgers and hotdogs, and members provided a dish to pass for the Saturday afternoon meal with some WALLEYES-R-US members joining in. The night was warm and muggy with the bonus of a few white-tail deer visiting our campsites!

Sunday was sunny, with temps in the mid-90s and no wind, which made fishing a little more difficult for some of us. However, some of the members were able to put together the right pattern (slipping) and brought some nice fish to the scale on Sunday.

Remember, at our outings members can use any access available on the lake we are fishing on as long as they arrive at the weigh-in location on time, either by boat or trailered back.

Our next and final Club Outing is August 18-19, 2007 at Upper Red Lake with weigh-ins scheduled for the access at the mouth of the Tamarac River. Some of the members are camping at Big Bog State Park near Washkish, Minnesota for the weekend.

### Is It Time To Add A NEW TWOET This Year? By Chad Maloy

Like most walleye nuts I try to attend as many walleye fishing seminars as I can. Luckily, I live in an area that has a strong walleye club. FM Walleyes Unlimited, Inc., located in the border towns of Fargo, ND & Moorhead, MN, has brought in numerous Freashwater Fishing Hall of Fame anglers such as Tony Dean, Babe Winkelman, Bob Probst, Sr., Gary Parsons, Keith Kavajecz, Marv Koep plus many other top walleye seminar presenters like Pete Harsh, Matt Straw, Bruce Samson, Dave Genz, Tommy Skarlis, Chip Leer, and the list goes on.

Many of these speakers have forgotten more about fishing for walleyes than the rest of us have learned in a lifetime. They have spent so much time on the water and have so much information to share. I think it's possible for some people to feel overwhelmed from information overload during some of these seminars. Many folks around here fish fairly simple with a jig or rig. They rarely stray from the tried and true techniques that have been handed down from generation to generation. Listening to the professional anglers talk about planner boards, in line weights, dive curves, line resistance, mapping chips, mega pixals, eventually turns into blah, blah, blah and the audience looses interest. Now this is not the case with the great speakers that have the ability to keep everyone entertained but low tech fishermen do get lost when the seminar gets too technical.

Marvin Fjeldseth is a member of our club and he is a great example. He is a retired banker and works part time as a parking lot attendant to avoid the pressures of life. He works the lot at my building (a bank) and we speak often about our fishing club. Marvin likes to fish as a way to relax. He enjoys the speakers we have but often gets lost in the techy things. I explained to Marvin that he does not have to worry about being able to master all the techniques and presentations that are discussed at the meetings. All he needs to be able to do is pick up one little item that will make him a better angler from each speaker and he will grow his fishing success. Confucius said "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step". Each seminar Marvin should concentrate on learning one new item. If he does this he will be on the road to becoming a better angler.

Use it or Loose it. Now that Marvin has learned these new and used fishing tips he needs to put them to use. Too many times I see club members attending all our meetings, listening to all the speakers divulge new ideas and tactics, and then they just continue on with their old methods of chasing walleyes. We need to get out of our comfort zone and try new ideas. You do not need to put in a big investment and buy all the latest gadgets to be on the cutting edge. You can start by committing to master a new presentation each year. Maybe this year you concentrate on learning how to run leadcore line effectively. Each time you go out commit yourself to give it a try for a few hours and eventually you will have success which will build your confidence in the system. When it is no longer a novelty and you grow your confidence to the point that you know you can catch fish you are ready to move on to master the next technique. Maybe you try bottom bouncers and spinners, pitching jigs and crank baits, snap jigging, slip bobbering, fishing extremely shallow eyes in 2 feet of water, using plastics, running planner boards, and on and on.

As Larry the Cable Guy says, "Git er Done" and put your noodle to work using the knowledge you've gained by attending all those seminars.
