

JANUARY MEETING RECAP:

The January 15th FM Walleyes Unlimited club meeting brought Jason Przekurat and approximately 82 club members to the Fargo Doublewood Inn on an evening where temperatures outside dipped into the –20's. Jason, a full time professional angler from Stevens Point, WI, provided a presentation entitled "Fishing New Water", which was packed with facts and practical approaches to finding fishing success whether participating in a tournament or on vacation. With his beginnings as a muskie angler in Wisconsin, Jason soon found his way to competitive walleye fishing and the challenges of fishing "new" water. Jason's four step approach to successfully decoding the secrets of "Lake Walleye" included:

- 1. What do you need to look for?
- 2. Evaluating fish locations
- 3. How to "read" water conditions
- 4. How to get them in the boat





In step one; Jason suggested examining lake maps now in January, when it's 20 below zero outside. This evaluation of the lake we will be targeting during the open water season allows us to become familiar with the lake before even getting the boat wet. If we wait until the day we arrive at the lake, we'll be certain to waste a good deal of precious fishing time. Jason recommends looking for the obvious points of interest that are recognizable on a map; structure & hazards, inlets & outlets, weed beds, submerged timber and other areas of probable fish location.

Step two takes this initial examination to the next level. Once we are on the water we will want to explore each of the locations that we identified on the map as points of interest. On the water, we will be looking for the "spot on the spot", the one place on that structure where the fish are congregating. Many times this means boating over

the area in a grid pattern, marking all essential elements with a waypoint on the GPS. This will create a "picture" and identifying the areas of special interest; inside and outside turns, changes in bottom content or weed species. When fishing a tournament, Jason's strategy is not just to find fish, but to find the spot containing the most fish and target that area.

Jason pointed out that walleyes migrate more than any other fish species except catfish. This migration creates challenges in patterning a school of fish. Water temperature is a big factor in their migration and another clue to which areas will be more productive. Other considerations shared by Jason included:

- 1. Areas where rocks and weeds intermingle are good areas to target
- 2. When fishing walleyes in flooded timber don't be afraid to "go in after them". Thick, nasty snags = big fish.
- 3. Fish cribs fish over the top of the cribs. Walleyes feed up and will often hang at the tops of the cribs waiting for a meal to swim over the top.
- 4. Flat shorelines fish these areas only in the wind. On calm days target structure.
- 5. Submerged rock piles or sunken islands identify and fish the shelf off of the edge of the reef. This is where the fish will congregate. Position your boat down wind from the structure and cast into the wind, over the target.

6. Mud flats are summer targets. Fish them with bottom bouncers and troll the flat in a grid pattern until the areas of fish concentration are identified.

Reading water conditions, the third step in successfully fishing new waters, is an "on the fly" activity. This part of the process is one that will change from day to day or perhaps hour to hour. Jason believes that wind has the biggest effect on fish position and activity. Wind creates feeding opportunities and drives active walleyes into shallow water. Jason recommended casting into the wind, allowing the boat to drift away from the structure if we are landing a fish, leaving it undisturbed. At worst, cast parallel to the wind avoiding a drift over or into the structure that is being targeted. Water clarity is the second consideration in "reading" the water. In clear water, extra care must be given to spooking the fish, where as in stained water the presence of a boat will rarely ruin the fish catching opportunities in that spot. Lastly, sunlight can also play a factor in the success of a particular spot on any given day. Jason stated that walleyes are most active during low-light periods of time and will shy away from bright lights.





Jason's fourth step in the process of fishing new water is choosing the right presentation for the spot and conditions. He advised that no one in the same boat should be fishing with the same lure until one of those individuals has caught at least two fish. Jason recommended plastics for jig fishing approaches. He added that when fishing with plastics they must be fished more aggressively than we would with live bait. When fishing slip bobbers, Jason recommends using orange bobbers and hi-visibility super line to allow easy identification of the rod to bobber connection. Jason also enjoys casting crank baits for walleyes. A #5 rattlin' rap is one of his favorite lures for this approach due to its ability to fish at various depths and it's ease of casting in windy conditions.

The evening concluded with a question/answer session where Jason explained in further detail some of the approaches that he has taken in specific situation.


