Thanks to the ND Game and Fish Department and the Minnesota DNR!

Terry Steinwand and Jason Scott of the ND Game and Fish Department and Dave Friedl and Philip Seefeldt of the MN DNR recently addressed questions at the May club meeting. A few highlights:

ND – Terry Steinwand – Lake Sakakawea is at an all time low. 130K acres of what once used to be water, is now exposed land. Anything below 1850 is public land. This is causing some issues with landowners and access. The department is working to get more boat ramps in working order. All tournaments held on the reservoir this summer will be kill tournaments. Devils Lake continues to rise. Many boat ramps are in trouble. Lack of funding is restricting the ability to extend ramps at this time.

MN – Dave Friedl - The DNR harvested 37 million walleye eggs from Lake Sallie and will be utilized in 51 rearing ponds. The DNR thanked FM Walleyes for their donations to the rearing ponds. There is an active sturgeon restoration program being implemented in our area. The Red, Roseau, and Buffalo rivers will be stocked with sturgeon. Ottertail and Big Detroit will also be stocked. Northern pike slot limits seem to be effective on area lakes. Walleye populations are good in area lakes. Winterkill lakes from the winter of 96/97 also look good for 04.

Enforcement officers, Jason (ND) and Philip (MN), finished by answering numerous questions from the group. Remember to keep your life jackets and cushions accessible when out on the water! Thanks again to Terry, Jason, Dave, and Philip.

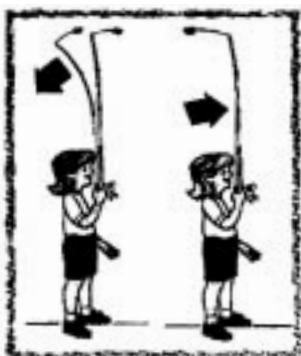

Prizes came from Northland Fishing Tackle, ND Game & Fish Dept. and Wal-Mart's Kids All-American Fishing Derby program.

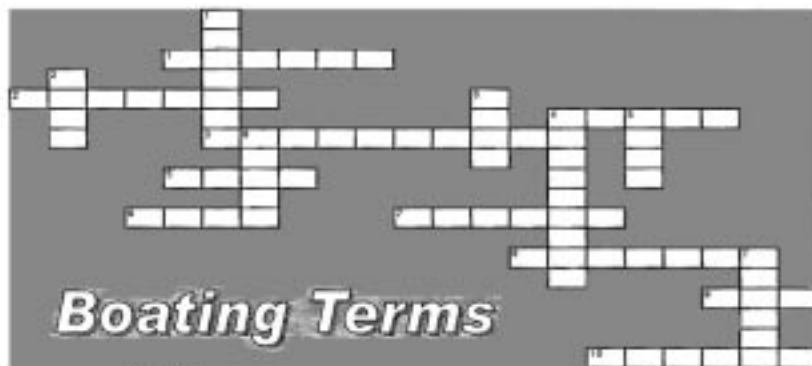


the Fry's Forum

Here's CASTING from 30 feet away.



To cast overhead at a target 30 feet away, begin with the rod straight up in the 12 o'clock position. Keep your casting elbow bent. Then snap the rod back with your casting wrist to about 10 o'clock. Keep your eye on the target. Snap the rod toward you with your casting wrist, begin to straighten your elbow and release the line when the rod is in the 2 o'clock position. If you release too soon, the lure will go up in the air without going to the target. But if you release too late, the lure will fall short.

Fishing Personalities

Dick Beardsley

The days have long passed since Dick was “Soaring with Eagles” the likes of; Frank Shorter, Alberto Salazar, and Steve Prefontaine all world class marathon runners of that time period. But time and lifestyles change and one passion is replaced with another. In Dick’s case it was his longtime love of fishing that drew him back to his roots.

Yes, he still runs, even daily, just not at the record pace that captured him a second place finish in The Boston Marathon as well as victories in many other world class events.

Dick’s professional fishing career started when he moved to Detroit Lakes, Minnesota in 1995 after finishing college and posting a lengthy impressive running career. Prior to this he became motivated to fishing during his high school days. Dick would travel from his home in the Minneapolis area with his dad to fish the lakes near Detroit Lakes and Bemidji. He even started guiding at the age of 14 on Lake Minnetonka near his home. This experience and the trips with his father, peaked his interest enough to return to Detroit Lakes and start his new career.

Now, in addition to guiding clients, Dick hosts a television show, “The Fishing Scene” in its 9th season, a weekly radio program on KFGO, and holds fishing seminars throughout North Dakota and Minnesota.

I found Dick to be a bundle of energy, a man who truly loves what he is doing. “I love what I do so much that I wake up at two in the morning and I just can’t wait to get up and see what the day will bring. Being on the water and enjoying the outdoors is just great, catching fish is a bonus”.

Dick took me to one of his hot spots for Crappie while I conducted the interview for this article. I thought I might sneak in some fishing myself after the interview was complete as Dick had suggested. But I became so engrossed in listening to Dick and what he was teaching me that it slipped my mind. Dick however, continually caught and released Crappie after Crappie during the interview in an area that did not look like it would hold any fish. “Don’t get stuck on fishing just one spot, be willing to experiment. Walleyes are often found where people don’t think they will be” Dick explains. This was his advice and it certainly holds for other fish as well because as I mentioned earlier, this part of the lake did not look like any Crappie hole to me.

Dick noted what a good organization F.M. Walleyes has become and the good things the club has done for fishing. He speaks highly also of the membership. He mentioned two members in particular, Tom Backer and Dave Randash. “These are a couple of guys I am in awe of, just two good old boys that came up the hard way and are now doing well. I wish them the best.”

I asked what his philosophy on fishing was, is there something that you can say that may help anyone become a better fishing person? “Attitude! If you go out with the attitude that you can’t catch fish, you probably won’t. Always keep a positive attitude.” After being around Dick for any length of time it is easy to see that he certainly follows this advice.

Dick has an excellent sense of humor. He told me a couple of things that took place while out guiding his clients. I will relate and hope Dick doesn’t mind that I pass these along.

Earlier in his fishing career Dick was on the water with some other guys. The older motor he was using didn’t want to start. So he was back there pulling the rope trying to get that thing to go when all of a sudden it did, and at the same time, all in one motion Dick hit the shift lever. He flew out the back of the boat into the water. The boat went about 20 yards until one of the guys got control and returned to pick him up.

On a more resent occasion, he was guiding on Lake Sallie. It was a cold September day, the wind was blowing the rain sideways but the walleyes, as Dick put it, were “hoppin’.” One of his live wells wasn’t working so he had a five gallon bucket along in the boat. The client caught a nice Walleye and Dick stepped up to net it. As he did, the wind caught him, he took a back step down and one foot went into the bucket. He and the Walleye went flying overboard. The line broken and Dick’s \$90 net went to the bottom of Lake Sallie where remains today. On both occasions Dick was unhurt but embarrassed and they all enjoyed a good laugh. Dick tells the stories with much more color however.

BJORKMAN & WILLITS TAKE 18TH ANNUAL PELICAN SPRING CLASSIC

David Bjorkman and Dana Willits brought in 6 fish for 10.52 pounds on the final day to jump from 13th place to win the 2004 Pelican Spring Classic held on Pelican Lake June 4th and 5th. The pair took home \$2,260 cash and \$1200 in Gift Certificates from Comfort King Mattress Factory. Bjorkman and Willits had a two-day total of 11 fish for 17.47 lbs. Second place went to Karl Hoppe and Eugene Ernst who weighed 9 fish for 16.86lbs winning \$1240 Third Place was Brian & Eric Bjorkman with 9 fish for 16.14 winning \$1115. The Day one Big Fish Pot winner was Jeff Atchison and Art Anderson with a 4.43 walleye. The big fish of the tournament Lunker Award went to Tim Amble and John Tobolt weighing 7.52lbs. Most fish were caught in 10-15 feet using shiners, crawlers or red tail chubs.

FM Walleyes handed out over \$17,000 in awards. 120 two-person teams brought in 226 fish weighing 347.5lbs on day one and 177 for 299.60 on day two. The average two-day weight for each walleye was 1.61 lbs.
