with "Legendary Angler" Bob Probst, Sr.

A walleye angling expert who in nearly 40 years, has developed into what some of the outdoor media/ writers call "the greatest walleye fisherman who has ever lived."

Inducted into the National Freashwater Fishing Hall of Fame as a "Legendary Angler" in 1993, Probst's angling experience reaches to Nebraska, Minnesota and the Dakotas. He can lay claim to many innovations to catch walleye. Trolling leadcore line, bottom bouncing with a spinner and crawler, power trolling for early spring walleyes, and using long rods to reach out.

Often referred to as uncanny, Bob's methods of producing walleyes on demand under any conditions have become legend with the walleye school of

anglers. Having followed the competitive routes of two major tournament trails, Bob has experienced walleyes and walleye habits in more situations than just about any man alive. He has demonstrated the ability to find walleyes faster than any other angler, especially when he hits new waters.

Fishing with partner Mike McClelland in the early days of the MWC circuit, this duo became the winningest team ever. They set more records with fish caught and money won then any other team, qualified for every Championship and won three Team-ofthe-Year titles.

Throughout his career, Bob has made a point of sharing his knowledge and information. He conducts enjoyable seminars and is always ready to answer questions, especially if it helps someone catch fish. Bob last graced FM Walleyes in 1998 and I hear many members talking about that seminar today.

Probst is definitely a living legend and this will be a meeting you will not want to miss. Thursday, March 16th at the Doublewood Inn, Fargo. Doors will open at 6:00 with the program starting at 7:00.

February Meeting Review by Jeremy Frie

Finding Wellege Feeding Frenzies

Dustin Kjeldon, a professional walleye angler from Brookings, SD spoke to the FM Walleyes crowd at the annual meeting. Dustin feels that on any body of water, at any given time, a school of large walleyes are feeding on anything and everything. His presentation concentrated on this topic.

Look Shallow

Less than 8' of water. Windy shorelines, funnels, weeds, and stained water are all key in locating feeding fish.

Speed

Move fast. Dustin spends just 10 minutes or so on a particular spot before moving to the next location.

Trolling Crankbaits

Fireline is his favorite choice of line. He also trolls fast, often at 2.5 mph or more.

Casting Crankbaits

"Hand to fin combat". Start with a very fast retrieve (as fast as you can reel). Make sure and pause the crankbait for best results. Favorite baits include the #4 and #5 Salmo hornet, the #4 jointed Shad Rap, and the #5 glass shad rap.

Cranking Jigs

Work the jig like a crankbait. Reel the jig back to the boat very quickly. Bottom contact is not needed with this method. Use larger twist tails (4-5") for the most action/vibration.

Slip-Babbing Trees

I really like pulling pig walleyes out of submerged timber. It is something I have had the privilege to do day after day. It can work in any season from ice out to freeze up. The fish seen here was taken in the middle of July in 8 feet of water. 7 or 8 foot soft tipped rods work great for long hooksets. Green 10 lb Fireline works great because it is easy to see from the distance and its strong enough - fish can be muscled and played out at the surface. That's where the soft rod tip comes into play - plus less jigs and bobbers are lost with this than with monofilament line. If cover is really thick stiff rods and a tight drag can help rip pigs out of the timber. One of my best walleyes, which was 31 inches long was skidded on top of the water and into the boat using stiff rods and a drag cranked down.

Tying an overhand not on a rubber band for a bobber stops gets the job done. They hold better on Fireline than nylon bobber stops and are a heck of a lot cheaper. My bait of choice is leeches, but minnows and worms work well from time to time. One trick that works with minnows when walleyes are turned off is to pinch the tailfin off the minnow. This allows



the minnow to wiggle, but the minnow can't move away from a big fish. Hooks and small jigs balanced out with split shot are the norm for lures.

Finding an area to fish is pretty easy. There is a stereotype that big areas can't be covered and it takes forever to find fish. This is far from the truth. It takes a little trial and error, but playing hopscotch in the trees can make covering an area a breeze. Tie up to a tree for 20 minutes if nothing happens, then move - sometimes 30 feet sometimes a few miles. It depends, but use your best judgment. After a while something will click. Be careful though, when approaching these waters. Use an electric trolling motor when wondering throughout the trees and approaching the area. In these shallow waters of 15 feet or less, walleyes may scare easily.

When looking for fish, look for warmer, turbid areas. These are the windswept shorelines that also tend to be bountiful with food. Areas adjacent to deep water is a factor that will stand out or is close to a spawning area. Thick trees are great, but you need openings in the trees that allow you to sneak a bobber into the strike zone. If you know there are a few rocks in the trees, that can be deadly. If you are in an area with a bunch of small trees and there is one big tree work the big tree first. Uprooted trees hold all sorts of macro-invertebrates such as freshwater shrimp, which is the main forage on Devils Lake and a big reason why the fishing is so great.

I believe that walleyes are like people and that they are lazy. Big walleyes just sit underneath logs and flair their gills from time to time for an appetizing meal. Now this works great in the walleye world, but the shrimp are like chicken nuggets; little tidbits that eventually fill the fish's belly. When I sneak a slip bobber in front of them the leech is like a big juicy steak that hovers in front of their face teasing them and eventually they hit.

Fish usually come in little streaks. Other tactics to try is dead sticking or jigging right next to the boat. Walleyes will move underneath the boat when the sun comes out or work the shadowy side of the trees. As water levels change a few feet from year to year the same trees still seem to work. The problem with each coming spring is from the demolition of trees from the moving ice. The great thing about this tactic is that #1 - it's effective and #2 - anybody can catch fish from a bobber.

There are times when action can slow significantly. For those times mix it up. Pitch jigs and vary the retrieve. Whether it is the movement or a different presentation you'll figure out what works. When you do - enjoy!
