Thursday, May 17th Doublewood Inn of Fargo Gary Thompson **Tri State Diving**



Detroit Lake's Tri State Diving owner Gary Thompson has been diving for 40 years. His combined interest in Walleye fishing and Scuba diving will provide a unique perspective to understand walleye behavior and habitat.

Thursday May 17th at the Doublewood Inn will be the second time FM Walleyes Unlimited has featured Gary's program. Gary has taught Scuba diving for 37 of his 40 years actively diving. He specializes in salvage recovery and training.

Insurance companies from all over work with Gary for salvage operations. There will be an 11 minute video taken during a salvage operation on Ottertail Lake

shown during the presentation. Hopefully, we won't recognize the vehicle being salvaged! Gary also trains law enforcement for both warm and cold water body recovery operations.

During his time underwater, Gary has observed how Walleye react to changes in their habitat, as well as how different sounds affect Walleye.

Meet Pete Montplaisir. Pete and his family, spouse Helen, son Justin, joined the club in 1993. They live in North Fargo, along with their dog Sadie. Pete is a Mechanic in the Transit Dept for



the city of Fargo. The first time I met Pete and his family was on a club outing at Waubay. Unfortunately for Pete, he took out his lower unit that weekend. Having gone to the same thing myself the year before, I knew how sick he felt. However not to let that dampen the family's weekend fishing outing, they fished from shore on Sunday, and probably caught more fish that those of us out in boats.

By now you know the four questions, so let's get to know Pete better.

Best fishing experience: "My best memories are fishing trips to the Dauphin river in Northern Manitoba when I was growing up, fishing the river with my Dad and Uncles. I remember the lure of choice was the Canadian Wiggler. Boy did we catch walleyes back then on the river in those little rental 14ft Lund boats."

The people who influenced my fishing the most: "*My Grandpa and my Dad. All the fishing we did on weekends at my Grandpa's cabin on Lake Maud.*"

Favorite fishing tactic: "*My favorite tactic is probably trolling. That seems to be what we do the most when we fish as a family. Funniest fishing experience: "In the last 4-5 years we have started to fish as many of the club tournaments as we can as a family. There have been a lot of fun weekends camping with all the different members of the FM Walleye Club. A lot of stories told around the camp fire, a lot of memories our son will have about all our past fishing trips to pass on, (hidden rocks in the water, #'s of satellites in the sky, scary stories, the big one that got away). April Program was Impressive

In-Depth Outdoors with James Holst & Chris Tuckner

James and Chris enlightened club members on spring walleye fishing on the Mississippi River near Red Wing. Tactics included pitching blade baits and a jig/ringworm combo up stream and working the lures as they drift down with the current. The duo stated it is very important to find areas featuring a seam between slack water and current. These areas typically have clearer water and are best fished during the bewitching hours which are the first hour of light and the last hour of light each day. Once the sun is up and boat traffic starts to run the fish tend to slip deeper. These fish are in the area at this time of year for one thing only and that is to spawn. Don't think that because they are spawning that they will not feed. The video cleared showed how far a spawning fish will inhale a jog or blade bait. When fishing the blade baits James worked them slowly. Most of us are

used to fishing these things with a fast erratic motion but James just likes a slow lift and then slow drop to let the current provide the action. Same with the ringworm and jig. No hopping and popping. Just a little lift and the current will sweep these lures to the fish who inhale them. All in all a lot was learned and a good time was had by everyone there.
