On November 30th Mr. Ice Fishing, Dave Genz will be at the Doublewood to entertain and show us some of the newest tactics, gear, and technologies. Dave is a legendary ice fisherman and has played a huge role in the ice fishing revolution.

Back in the day anglers would fish at one spot a day maybe two, but Dave saw it another way. He wanted to steer ice fishing in another direction. Dave envisioned hard water fisherpersons could have the mobility of soft water fisherman, while still remaining comfortable in the cold that winter offers.

Throughout the years Dave has designed, tested and modified many products that are out today. From the very portable Fish Trap ice house to augers, accessories, fish

finders and snowsuits; Dave was somewhere there trying to improve the product. There have even been a few lines of fishing rods and ice tackle that have been solely developed by Dave. Maybe the most famous is the Genz Bug. It was created to be a small jig, yet fish like a heavy lure.

Dave is the captain of Ice Team; an organization dedicated to the sport of Ice Fishing. In addition Ice Team sponsors the Super Trap Attack, a tournament tour that stretches across the ice belt. Mr. Ice Fishing has written many articles, appeared on show like Mid West Outdoors, and has presented across the country, sharing his knowledge and skills with fellow anglers.

Meeting Review:


Tom Chapin - October 19th, 2006

Tom Chapin gave a great informational and humorous seminar that included facts, and stories of poachers whom he caught. Tom was a Conservation Officer for the Minnesota DNR for 29 years. Over that time he patrolled the Pelican Rapids area and spent his last few years on Lake Winnie.

According to Tom poaching is the second highest grossing illegal activity; first being illegal drugs. Approximately 10 billion dollars are made a year by poachers. Less than 5% of the people participating in outdoors activities participate in poaching and of that 5% less than 1% is caught.

Tom has been involved in a few high speed chases at 7:00am on Sunday mornings. "Only in my job can that happen", said Tom jokingly. The unlawful was catching perch and hauling them to Milwaukee to sell at local bars. Tom was also had the biggest walleye bust in Minnesota. It happened in the Leech Lake area. Tom opened a trunk to find 186 walleyes that were going to a Wisconsin Fire Department Fish Fry. Tom even has caught people cutting the lengths of pike with scissors so that the fish would fit in the slot limit.



After the stories were over and pictures shown Tom had a little question and answer session. According to Tom officers cannot enter an ice house without a warrant or consent.

Tom also spoke of the importance of other outdoorsman and the role that they play in catching poachers. Most of Tom's arrests came from the help of people reporting illegal activity and occurred while the activity took place. Cell phones have helped quite a bit. There are anonymous tip lines in almost every state and people are using them.

RED LAKE YEAR END OUTING August 19, 20 2006

Our final outing for 2006 was held on newly opened (for Walleyes) Red Lake, near Washkish, MN. We stayed at Big Bog State Park and some of the group were treated to nice display of Northern Lights after the campfire on Saturday night.

The Fish Godz evidently were looking favorably on our group of nine boats by giving us blue skies, medium - to - light winds, and a good fish bite for the weekend festivities.

We started Saturday eight miles out to the west on Center Bar near the Reservation boundary. Most fish were caught pulling sticks however, we had our best results using jigs and live bait. Most everyone fished 6-10 feet of water. The biggest fish weighed on Saturday was a 1 3/4 lb. Crappie caught by Brianna F. on a #5 Clown Shad Rap, mainly because Walleyes 17" (with the tail pinched) through 26" have to be immediately released back into the stained, sugar sand waters of the big lake.

Sunday was another great day with some large Northern also being released in addition to everyone bringing their two walleyes to the scale except Mary H. (sorry Mary).

Breakfast was literally "in the bag" on both Saturday and Sunday, you'll have to ask one of the group what that means. Just remember the 13 minute rule, courtesy of Kathy S. Fresh Walleye, "Hall Style", was on tap for Saturday along with chunked and battered potatoes plus lots of stuff for the sweet tooth, thanks to Helen M.

The trip was definitely one of the highlights of our Summer, lots of history, a possible timberwolf. sighting three public accesses to the lake just in this area alone, and very good walleye fishing during the heat of the day. Oh, one last thing, Steve G. claims there are over 8,500 working satelites in space, according to the NASA website.
