Ross Hagemeister, 36, is a full time professional fishing guide. He is married to his wife Kelly and they have two children. Ross was born and raised in St. Cloud MN. After graduating high school he spent 4 years in the Marine Corps infantry as a machine gunner.

Shortly after his Marine Corps tour, he enrolled at Bemidji State University where he earned a Bachelors degree in English. In 1995, during the summer after his first year in college, he bought

a used Lund boat and began Meister Guide Service in the Ottertail Lakes area. After a very meager first two years his guide service began to see a steady increase in both return clientele and new fishermen as well.

By the time he graduated from Bemidji State (4yrs), Ross decided to turn his summer-time job into a career. After operating Meister Guide Service for 13 seasons he has logged an estimated 12,000 guiding hours on Ottertail Lake (open water). Ross also has a strong working knowledge of at least 10 more lakes throughout Ottertail and Douglas counties where he has spent the vast majority of his time fishing for walleye.

Cormorant Classic Wrap Up

The Cormorant Classic was the recipe for perfect fishing conditions. There were light winds of 5-15mph, reasonable air temperatures, sun, and no rain. Many of the competitors found themselves stripping off layers of clothing, instead of putting more on to stay warm. The mild weather had some effect on the bite, as competitors struggled to determine what depth to find the big fish; however, it wasn't long before some discovered the secret.

Day one of the tournament produced several big fish. Keith Nelson and Thomas Spieker took the top prize with a weight of 5.19 pounds. Second place went to Gary and Lisa Enger with a big fish weight of 5.13 pounds. Third place belongs to Kyle Agre and John Agre with a fish weighing 5.09 pounds.

On top of the leader board after day one was Mike Kerzman and Marshal Koep with a weight of 14.39 pounds. Second place was held by Bruce & Melissa Boedigheimer with a total weight of 13 pounds, and third place belonged to Brad Carr and Brian Bladow with a combined weight of 12.39 pounds. All total for day one there were 118 fish caught weighing 227 lbs.

Day two started with an awesome pinkish colored sun rise and a bit more wind coming across the lake. The fishing teams were very anxious to get out on the lake. In reverse order from the day before, the flights were released one by one, and they sped to their favorite honey holes to rediscover the bite for day two.

By the days end, the winner of the tournament would come in with a combined weight of over 20 pounds between the two days. Brad Carr and Brian Bladow took the top cash prize with 20.39 lbs. Second place Keith Nelson and Thomas Spieker weighed in with 19.61 pounds, while third place went to Bruce & Melissa Boedighiemer with 17.91 lbs. All three teams talked about their technique and choice of bait during the awards ceremony. Red tail minnows were the bait of choice for these walleye hunters, however, presentation varied between trolling, jigging and lindy rig.

The "cool under pressure" award went to Ron Wagner and Leroy Granbois. They went from 54th place on day one to 8th place on day two and received a gift certificate for a nights stay at the Doublewood Inn. Fall from glory was awarded to Fred Sanchez and Chris Roehl. They ended day one in 18th place and fell to 42nd on day two. They received a gift certificate for a night's stay at the Cormorant Inn's Hot tub Suite.

The perfect weather conditions this year had everyone talking and expressing their gratitude for such a successful year of tournaments. The top winning team of Brad Carr and Brian Bladow expressed their appreciation by donating \$400 back to FM walleyes in honor of all the volunteers that help produce these tournaments. It is their wish that this money be use to host a celebration in honor of the volunteers. It was a wonderful philanthropic gesture on their part and greatly appreciated!

September Meeting Recap

Director of North Dakota Game and Fish Department, Terry Steinwand, shared his "State of the Resources" perspectives on fishing and hunting in North Dakota. Terry, having spent many years as a fisheries expert, was in his element sharing information and answering questions from FM Walleyes members and guests.

Terry discussed specific fisheries such as Lake Sakakawea, Missouri River, and Devils Lake. Devils Lake attributed for much of the discussion, both during Terry's presentation and the question and answer portion. Terry explained that the presence of many smaller walleyes in Devils Lake is not necessarily a sign of the decline of the fishery. "Trophies are trophies for a reason, ... they are not common. If they were common, they wouldn't be trophies". The small fish, as Terry stated, are actually indicative of a very strong, healthy fishery and a sign of good things to come in the future.

Efforts of the ND Game and Fish Department to prevent carp from entering Devils Lake were discussed. Many who were present were not aware of the carp threat facing the current Devils Lake fisheries and the challenges that the game and fish department have dealt with. Terry explained what the department has done, the close calls where immediate action was required, and the current efforts to acquire land to build a permanent barrier. Terry concluded that if carp were to enter and take hold in Devils Lake, we would expect to see approximately a 50% decline in the desirable species currently inhabiting the lake.

Exotic, invasive species were also a significant topic of discussion on Thursday night. Terry expressed his concern of an invasive species being brought into North Dakota. With invasive species present in Minnesota, the possibility of traveling across state lines is always present. The importance of draining live wells, bilge water and cleaning vegetation from trailers was emphasized. Bunk trailers present an additional threat, even for the cautious angler as the possibility of vegetation getting caught between their boat and the bunks always exists. Terry shared that both wash stations and enforcement stops could be means of preventing invasive species from entering North Dakota.

In addition, Terry answered questions regarding the comeback of Devils Lake perch, the presence of gizzard shad in the Missouri River, and the effect of the late winter/spring on walleye reproduction. He also gave an update on sharptail grouse, pheasant, waterfowl and big game hunting.

-Advertisers/Tournament Sponsors, Don Marty. Don asked board for approval to complete a first draft of the Advertiser & Sponsor Fee list. He would like input & ideas before the final draft will be done. Motion to allow Don to move forward on the list made by Scott Brewer, second by Brian Dahlin. Motion passed.

-Youth Raffle, Scott Brewer. Ticket sales are over 330 so far for the 1st Youth Raffle. Tickets will be available at the meeting on Thursday. Drawing will be held after the speaker on Thursday night.
