## The "A" Team takes the 2004 Cormorant Fall Classic

Cormorant Lake, Becker County, MN....Art Anderson, Horace, ND and Jeff Atchison, Lake Park,MN won the 2004 FM Walleyes Unlimited, Inc., Cormorant Fall Classic on Big Cormorant Lake Saturday, September 25th. They took home \$4,300 in prizes including \$3,100 cash and \$1,200 worth of bedding from Comfort King Mattress Factory. Fishing against 90 of the regions best walleye anglers, Anderson & Atchison landed 9 fish for 18.66lbs over the two-day tournament to claim the win. Anderson & Atchison placed 8th at the Pelican Spring Classic earlier this year. The pair also claimed the day- one big fish award with a 4.74lb walleye. The day- two big fish award went to the team of Ronald Wagner & Larry Grandbois who pulled in a 5.91lb walleye to which claimed the Lunker Award for the largest walleye of the tournament.

Tournament anglers brought in 123 fish weighing 223.16lbs on day one and 120 fish weighing 220.50lbs on day two. Overall, 243 fish were caught weighing in at 443.65 lbs with the average walleye weighing 1.98 lbs. The top finishers were as follows:

## Fishing **Dersonalities** by Jack Fuller

#### PREPARING YOUR BOAT AND MOTOR FOR STORAGE

Hey boys and girls, what time is it? Well, for you old enough to remember; it is not Howdy Dowdy Time and this is not Buffalo Bob. But it is time to get that boat and motor ready for winter storage or winterized as it is termed in the northland. Your boat served you well

all summer; now let's put it to bed in good condition so it is ready to go again next spring.

Again this year, I solicited help from of some of our area specialists:

- 1. Dan Wall from Moorhead Marine is the head technician and Shop Manager.
- 2. Chris Kimberlin, Parts and Service Manager at Crystal-Pierz, Fargo.
- 3. Jeff Huguelet, General Manager with Interstate Battery (17th ave. store) Fargo.

Start at the gas tank, a fuel conditioner such as OEM or Stabil should be used to prevent the gas from breaking down. Conditioners should also be used throughout the season if your boat sits idle for any length of time. Stabilizers are good for about 12 months. If the gas is not used in that time drain it and use it in your car or lawn mower. Keep fresh gas in your boat. The expenses of "cooking" out your carburetors if varnish builds up is not worth the neglect. Most motors are set to run on 87 octanes, but if you feel better about it use premium.

Dan and Chris both use many of the same techniques for motor preparation:

- 1. Start the engine and spray "fogging oil" in each carburetor liberally or until the motor stops (be sure to have the water supply hooked up). Take out the spark plugs and spray some in each cylinder. Turn the engine over a few times slowly while adding the oil and replace the plugs. If you need new plugs, spring is the time to change, right after running out the seasonal fogging oil.
- 2. Change the oil filter and oil on 4 stroke motors. Grease all zerks.
- 3. Check for worn hoses and wires.
- 4. Drain the lower unit and replace with new gear lube. If the old lube is milky or you see signs of water, there probably is a seal leaking. See your dealer for replacement.
- 5. Remove the prop and check for fish line etc., grease the shaft and replace. This is a good time to look for nicks and other prop damage.
- 6. Check the wheel bearings on the trailer. They should be repacked in the fall or spring each year. Are all the lights working on the trailer? It's time to take care of that also. Trailer brakes; roll back the rubber boots on the wheel cylinders to see if there is corrosion. Light grease helps here. Remember, they are submerged each time you launch and load.

Take care of the boat also. Wash and wax is a good idea. Clean the floor and carpet, get those old worms and crushed minnows out. Wipe down the dash and scrub the bugs off the windshield.

What about those batteries? Jeff says they are one of the most neglected pieces of equipment on the boat! Vibration is one of the biggest causes of failure, anchor them down well. In addition; check the water level regularly, see that the plates are covered with water, and charge fully after each use (12.66 volts), but do not overcharge. Check the battery in a couple of days to see that this reading was not just a surface charge. Bring it to a full charge at this time if necessary. It is always best to charge at a slow rate, 2 amps if you have the time. However, never charge at more that 10 amps. When storing, bring the batteries to a full charge and clean them up. They can be stored in your garage, shed, or whatever. For a fully charged battery to freeze it must get colder than – 85 degrees. Look over the cables for corrosion and clean. A little vasoline or light grease will help prevent corrosion. Modern batteries may be stored on wood or concrete. The old wives tale of batteries being drained on concrete is false. I come from the old school and have a hard time storing without placing a board underneath however. If you leave them in your boat unhook the cables.

Authors note: a digital voltmeter is very important piece of equipment to own. They are small and inexpensive. Carry one in your boat and use it regularly.

So, tick, tick, tick, the time is getting near. Get out and get at it. If you feel you can't handle the job or don't have time, contact one of guys mentioned above, they will be happy to do it for you.



# George Feder and the Power Tiller Steering

George Feder, Nevis, MN, gave a great presentation on the advances in tiller steering. The power tiller steering system can be seen at www.enginesteer.com. The manufacturer has taken a complicated system, placed it on a tiller handle, and the end result is an easy to use setup that makes running a tiller motor very enjoyable. The unit takes up about the same space as a battery and can be placed in any rear compartment. The original

tiller handle is replaced by a new handle that reacts to pressure. When pressure is placed on the handle, the motor will turn with ease. Once your hand is removed from the handle, the unit locks in place and the motor will not turn at all.

George brought his '03 620T Ranger with steering system on a 115 Optimax motor for the demonstration. Three guys holding the motor could not stop a volunteer demonstrator from turning the motor with two fingers! Amazing! Many members jumped in the boat to try out the system.

If you would like to try the system on the water, look George Feder up. He is willing and anxious to demonstrate the system to all interested parties!


