# TILLERS ARE BACK! George Feder Tiller Power Steering System

George Feder, Nevis, MN is bringing his 620T Ranger equipped with a 125 Merc and Tiller Power Steering. The Power Steering System prototypes were used on 5 boats last year with great success. This year they are launching the retail version. The tiller power steering system is controlled by a replacement grip/throttle that is pressure sensatitive. This is the key to the operation. You have the normal control of the tiller, but with the advantage of "Power Steering". The tiller handle stays put exactly where you leave it without having to tighten any wing nut like a "normal" tiller, but if you need to adjust it you can with just the bump of the grip with your fingertip if you want to move it. If you try to move the handle without touching the grip it won't budge!

## Pitch'N & Cork'N

Shallow water walleyes are a lot of fun to catch and Devils Lake, ND is a prime location to do it. Living just a couple of hours from Devils Lake I take many trips there and each year has produced numerous fish near 6lbs and many over 8lbs. The most memorable ones were caught in water not much more than knee deep.

Fishing for these shallow water walleyes I revert back to my bass fishing days. Visualizing areas where walleyes can lay in wait to easily pounce on an unsuspecting baitfish. It is important to locate prime fish holding structure. This is key to being successful.

A favorite area of mine can be found in a shallow bay lined with reeds. The reeds do not grow in a straight line but rather they grow in a random fashion creating mini bays, points and cuts, classic places for fish to attack. The preferred method of targeting these ambush areas is pitching jigs and crank baits. My favorite bait for this presentation is the new Northland Fishing Tackle MIMIC MINNOW®. The mimic minnow is a hot new molded soft plastic lure featuring a holographic Baitfish-Image body that swims and wiggles to mimic a chewy baitfish minnow. The construction of the bait makes it wobble from side to side during the retrieve creating lots of flash while the paddle tail gives off lots of vibration – a deadly combination. Pitching the lure right up next to the cover is very important. Work the area from different angles pitching straight at it and also from either side. Get that lure into those little nooks and crannies. You never know where those fish are hanging out. The fish can be really stacked in these areas so don't be afraid to work the same area over good. My last trip resulted in 20 fish caught within one hour, all within a small area of reeds not more than 50 yards long.

A second very popular location on Devils Lake is the flooded timber. Walleyes love to hide in and around branches and thick bushes commonly referred to as buck brush. Again, the walleyes wait for an easy meal to swim by and then they pounce on them. These areas are great producers but they are challenging to fish. Fish are found in the thickest, snaggiest locations making pitching a crank bait nearly impossible. Anglers lose many crank baits in the trees and this can get expensive. These areas where the new mimic minnow shines. The stand up jig makes it very snag resistant as the single hook design catches far less snags than a crank-bait with treble hooks.

When working timber it is again important to work the area from all angles. Pitch the lure past the area holding fish and work it back. This way the splash doesn't spook them and they have time to feel, hear and see it coming. The single hook design allows the jig to be pitched into and over logs without snagging. Mimic minnow's come in many different weights allowing you to search different depths and speeds. A good fishing friend of mine told me "you just can't pitch these things out and crank 'em in. You have to let the fish tell you what they want." Varying retrieve speed is crucial in locating the specific cadence that will trigger the fish.

Another great tactic on Devils Lake is corking. An ideal location is a shallow flat with lots of thick brush and trees near deep water. The fish can be in water from 4 to 15 feet deep. I look for the thickest, snaggiest site I can find and that is where my bobber is going to go. Normally when using slip bobbers I like a longer rod which allows you to pick up the slack line quickly for a good hook set but while fishing in the trees the last thing you want is a long rod getting stuck in a branch as you are trying to cast. In the tight quarters found amongst the trees a longer rod limits the ways you can cast or pitch bobbers. Using a shorter rod in the thick trees is critical. My corking set up consists of a 6'6' Fenwick Techna AV rod and a Cardinal 672 reel loaded with 8 or 10lb Flame Fireline. I use the fireline because it is strong and with the Flame color it is also highly visible. A bobber stop is the first item installed followed by a \_ "Lite-bite slip bobber. Next I slide on a small egg sinker and finally tie on a snap swivel using a palomar knot. Then I attach a snell consisting of a #2 chartreuse Super-Glo Neon Attractor hook. I tie these onto a short snell using 8lb Berkley XT anywhere from 18-24 inches in length. I then install a chartreuse Hot-Spot split shot followed by a nice big juicy leech.

I use this method cork'n in the heavy timber to save time. Fishing in branches and bushes, it's a given you'll encounter snags. Using a normal slip bobber rig and busting off will result Good Burgers... in loosing your whole setup bobber and all. By using a heavier main line such as Fireline tied to a snap swivel, it will allow the lighter snall to break off first, saving your bobber sinker and stop. All that is

to a snap swivel, it will allow the lighter snell to break off first, saving your bobber, sinker and stop. All that is needed to reload is to snap on a new snell, pinch on a new hot spot splitshot, add a juicy jumbo leech and pitch the rig back into the wood. I tie up over a dozen snells each day and put them onto a tackle tamer to keep them nice and organized. Fishing in the trees can be fast and furious so time saving tactics mean more fat walleyes in the boat.

In summary, Devils Lake is an angler's paradise where many tactics can be used effectively. Don't be afraid to try something new.

# Fishing Personalities By Jack Fuller

### MIKE DAHL

The nice part of having a job like this one is, I get to meet and learn from so many up-beat, knowledgeable people. These folks are "into" their sport and respect it.

This month's personality, Mike Dahl, is no exception.

Mike is a Fargo native, a South High graduate who with his wife Gina lives in Fargo where he manages Northwest Auto Body. I was originally planning to feature Mike in last month's "Walleye Lines" but found out he was on his honeymoon. Mike tells me that he finally found a girl that likes to fish and lets him fish. Two thumbs up on that Mike! Congratulations Mike and Gina!

Mike first got into fishing a long time ago when he became inspired by Tom Backer and Dave Randash before they got their tournament starts. "We had an actual league back then called "Better than Golf Fishing League which later changed to Walleyes-R-Us". Mike became actively involved in these before he entered into tournament fishing about 15-16 years ago. Some of Mike's more resent accomplishments include several top ten finishes in the "F.M. Walleyes" annual tournament on Pelican Lake including a first place spot two years ago. A second place P.W.T. finish on Lake Sharpe put Mike up with the big guys.

Some information Mike would like to pass on to aspiring tournament fishermen: To gain sponsorship in the tournaments does not only include wins, but product promotion, showing good sportsmanship, and be approachable to the public. Public relations are very important factors that sponsors look for.

Where does Mike fish? "I made all my money fishing the entire Missouri River System. That is my favorite complete water, Pelican Lake is locally, and Devils Lake is my favorite Lake". What do you like the best when it comes to presentation Mike? "I made my money trolling, but I love live bait rigging the most, it takes me back to my roots in western Minnesota. Jigging would be next and trolling third. The use of lead core is becoming a big part of my arsenal and once you learn how to use it, and get confident with it, you use it more and more".

I asked Mike for a tip for fall fishing; "Don't give up to early, people talk about lake turn over and some lakes turn over really late, just keep on going, some of the best fishing is in the fall even November".

Mike offered a few words of wisdom for angles to think about:


- 1."Don't leave fish to find fish"
- 2."Fish your own fish, don't just go over to where the boats are".
- 3. "Run and gun if you don't find fish". If you are looking for big fish to win a tournament, move until you find them. Stick to your game plan; don't run scared from place to place without a reason.

Mike, what are some of the mistakes the week-end anglers make? "Many get stuck in their ways, no diversification. They just put on that spinner and crawler and do the same thing over and over. Those that are learning new methods and new techniques are more successful. Also anglers need good electronics and know how to use them. If you see fish you should be able to catch them".

Mike is a four season fisherman; he puts in about 119 days per year on the water. He feels as much at home on the ice as he does on soft water. If you are looking for Mike on ice he should be easy to spot. He has a large fish house painted to match his Lund 2025. Inscribed on the side is: **Lund Hard Water Series, Pro-Ice**. That's cool Mike, very original!

Good Luck Mike, hope to see you on the water!
