That one practice day was spent learning to fish with "only a plain hook and a sinker". "Why doesn't anyone use blades or beads around here?" was one of the comments overheard of the team from Manitoba. Well, Saturday morning a plain hook and sinker proved to do the trick for Team Canada. Shortly after pulling into their second spot of the day they landed a beautiful walleye that weighed in at just under six pounds, putting them in first place for big fish at the end of the day. They added another weigh fish later in the day to add to their total. Sunday was not as fortunate as they were only able to muster up one weigh fish and were bumped into third place for big fish of the tournament.



We hope that Team Canada had as much fun fishing the Cormorant Classic as we had having them join us. Whether it was over hearing their rendition of "Oh, Canada" out on the water or listening to their antics while playing cards during the evenings, many memories will remain from "Team Wiser's" time on Big C.

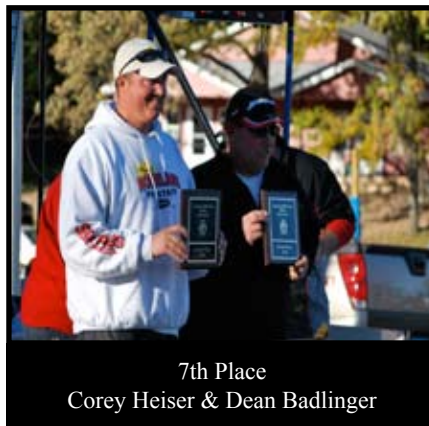

## POSSIBLE VENTURING CREW WITHIN FM WALLEYES

FM Walleyes Unlimited has a long history of supporting youth education in the outdoor sports. Most, if not all of the focus of this education has been targeted toward younger individuals, teaching them about the sport of fishing. Recent discussions within the board of directors has led to the exploration of potential educational opportunities for older children and young adults.

The Venturing program offers just such an opportunity for FM Walleyes. Venturing, a program of the Boy Scouts of America, offers youth ages 14 through 20 the opportunity to build and run an organization focusing an area of their interest. It is best compared to a "civic organization" that is run by it's youth members. Venturing is open to both male and female youth, with or without scouting experience. The FM Walleyes board of directors' vision for a potential Venturing crew would include participants from both club member families and external families who all have an interest in fishing and outdoor sports. The Venturing crew could provide needed volunteers to support existing FM Walleyes club activities as well as develop their own projects and events. The Venturing crew would select their own officers, some of which could attend the FM Walleyes board meetings and provide input from a youth perspective to situations affecting the club.

The FM Walleyes board of directors is seeking input in two areas. First, are there youth in the age range of 14 to 20 who would be interested in participating in this type of organization? And secondly, are there any adults who would be willing to fill roles as mentors and leaders during the formation of the Venturing crew and on-going afterward. Without adult mentors and leaders a successful Venturing crew would not be possible. ## SEPTEMBER 2010 RECAP

New products, new technology and new strategies to implement these innovations. That is what those who attended the September 2010 FM Walleyes Unlimited meeting held at the Doublewood Inn were provided with. Cody Roswick, District Sales Manager for Pure Fishing and Chris Meyer, Mille Lacs guide and Lowrance, Navionics & Clam pro staff member each shared insights into new product offerings from their respective companies.

The Pure Fishing organization includes industry leading brands; Berkley, Stren, Spiderwire, Shakespeare, Pflueger, Abu Garcia, Fenwick, Penn, All Star, Mitchell and Johnson. Cody highlighted some of the new products in these lines starting with the Fenwick Elite Tech rods. These top of the line fishing rods are designed for species and technique specific applications. He mentioned that Abu Garcia has also brought out a new line of rods for those who enjoy bass fishing.

New technology in fishing reels included Abu Garcia's new series of bait casting reels, the Black Max, Silver Max and Pro Max. These low profile bait casters features a "flipping switch", popular with anglers who use them for bottom bouncing. Pflueger offers several new spinning reels with oversized spools and rubber grommets designed to accommodate fluorocarbon and braided lines, eliminating the need to use monofilament backing or taping the line.

Gulp! has dominated the artificial bait market for the past several years. Cody discussed some of the ways to keep Gulp! fresh and usable and ways to keep Gulp! Alive containers from leaking. New to the Gulp! line up includes the 1" minnow, leech, worm and crickets, 3" fry nightcrawlers, floating Gulp! minnows, and Gulp! shad guts for cat fishing.

Powerbait, Berkley's PVC based plastic baits have added several new baits. The new additions include the 3" & 4" ripple shad, T-tail minnows and 2", 3" & 4" minnows.

Cody also shared some insights into the Flicker Shad, Berkley's crank bait. This lure has become very popular with anglers who use them for trolling and casting situations. A video highlighting the most effective ways to use the Flicker Shad was also played.

In addition to his responsibilities with Pure Fishing, Cody Roswick also serves on the board of directors of the National Professional Anglers Association. NPAA membership is open to all avid anglers and provides discounts on products and boat insurance along with a voice in legislative actions affecting anglers and outdoors enthusiasts.

Chris Meyer focused much of his time on the new HDS line of sonar/gps units from Lowrance. New products from Lowrance include the Elite 5 DSI and Mark 5 DSI units. The Elite 5 combines a gps capable, downview color sonar unit in the price range of \$550 to \$650. This offers anglers the option to purchase a new technology unit at a very affordable price. The Elite 5 uses analog sonar as opposed to the digital sonar in the HDS line. The Mark 5 is the black/white equivalent to the Elite 5 and is available for approximately \$300. These units will be great options for those anglers looking to upgrade to current technology or to add a second unit to their boat.

Chris shared some suggestions for those who are using, or considering purchasing one of the Lowrance HDS units. He pointed out that the "shallow water" mode actually includes all water under 100' deep. The "deep water" mode is best left to those fishing or boating on the great lakes or oceans. By using the "shallow water" setting, the units are able to operate more efficiently and respond quicker.

These units, Chris points out, are set up from the factory with settings that are water ready. Adjustments in the settings are not needed as they were in the older LCX series. Several screen shots demonstrating the effectiveness of the new downscan technology were shared as well. This new wave in the HDS line of products allows the angler to "see" what is below the boat instead of needing to interpret the vertical sonar returns on the older units.

Care of these new units was also discussed. Chris recommends using a mixture of 50% distilled water and 50% vinegar for washing the screens. Windex or other glass cleaners should not be used, as they can damage the surface of the screen. Also, it is not recommended that the units be transported on the boat. Continual bouncing and vibration caused by riding on the boat can shorten the life of the unit.
