

"ANGLERS NIGHT OUT" WITH JAMES LINDNER

Well over one hundred avid anglers, many suffering from extreme cases of cabin fever, gathered at the Kelly Inn on Thursday, March 24th for FM Walleyes Unlimited "Anglers Night Out" event. This event, an annual tradition as winter gives way to spring and we start focusing on the open water season ahead of us, was sponsored by KFGO and Beverage Wholesalers. The evening was started at 7pm sharp with special MC for the evening Mike McFeely of KFGO radio. Mike congratulated the club again for their induction into the Fishing Hall of Fame. This was handed off to Steve Hall who was here to recognize and present the "Distinguished Member Award" to a member of FM Walleyes Unlimited. This year's award, chosen from nominees by a panel of the past five DMA winners, was given to Barry Chouinard. Barry has given countless hours of his time as Classic Cup tournament director, AYA Co-Director, being involved in youth education, Take a Vet fishing event, membership and Take a Kid fishing at White Earth Lake. Congrats to Barry for an award well deserved.

James Linder was up next and said that "this is my favorite group to speak too, a fishing club". His goal here tonight, was to cover "How to become a better angler". James said he has fished all over North America and his favorite fish to catch are "The ones that are biting"!

To become a better angler, you must understand the fish. Habitat, seasonal movement, and forage location are key. In the winter, fish are going to be in the deep warm water basins. In the Spring, they will certainly be in the warmest water on the lake, but that location depends on the specific characteristics of that lake. One thing is almost always certain, 90% of the year, forage is the key factor in fish location. Big food shelves are where to start looking. "Fish are prisoners of their habitat."

James asked, "how many have you been at the boat landing and heard, 'the fish weren't biting today'?" James' thought is, "No, you just were not where the fish were biting". Fish move; just because they were there yesterday, does not mean that they will be there today. You have to be on the move also. "Walleyes are more vertical than any other fish... Look for baitfish."

James says that, "electronics and mapping are the biggest advancement in fishing". Using your electronics you can find fish that are holding on very specific spots on certain structures in the lake. "...Good spots are good spots."

"When it comes to baits, depth is most important. Size next, and speed. Most of the time walleyes are in neutral or negative feeding moods. The more walleyes are feeding on the forage, the more selective they will be."

"Using shad raps in the Spring, fish them shallow. In the Fall, I fish them deep. The X-Rap is my favorite and most versatile lure. The Extreme lure!!! You can fish it fast and rip it or you can let it idle and slow to entice them to bite. Fish are always biting, you just have figure out what they want. "

The evening concluded with drawings for membership raffle, the general raffle and a special raffle consisting of a trolling package and a limited edition print donated to FM Walleyes Unlimited by the Boy Scouts Northern Lights Council.



YOUTH ROD BUILDING CLASS EXPANDS IN 2011

FM Walleyes Unlimited partnered with Chuck DeRemer and Scheels All Sports to put on the largest youth rod building class to date. On Saturday, March 5th a group of 15 young anglers met at Scheel's in Fargo, focused on learning the craft of custom rod building. LAKE WINNIPEG ICE FISHING EXCURSION OFFERED ANGLERS CHALLENGES & REWARDS

Nearly ninety FM Walleyes Unlimited members traveled to Selkirk, Manitoba on March 18th through the 20th to fish for trophy greenback walleyes on massive Lake Winnipeg with members of the Walleye Anglers Association of Manitoba, or WAAM club. A good number of the participants traveled to Canada early to get in a few extra days of fishing prior to the event and to help pre-fish different areas of the lake in hopes of finding active fish for the group to pursue during Saturday's outing. One such individual was FM Walleyes Unlimited Vice President, Scott Brewer along with his son Adam and friend Chris. The three left Fargo/Moorhead very early on Wednesday morning in hopes of getting some quality time on the ice yet that day. They met up with club members Jay Kulla of Fargo and Craig Ferris of Winnipeg out on the ice. Having only fished for a short time Adam caught a beautiful 8 ½ lb. greenback. What a great way to start a fishing trip, how could it get better than that? After a few photos the fish was successfully released. Another ten minutes had barely passed when he noticed a heavy mark on his flasher suspended up off of the bottom. He raised his Live Target Golden Shiner up to meet the mark and within a brief moment had hooked into the fish of a lifetime. Adam proceeded to ice a 31" 14+lb class monster that would make any accomplished walleye angler jealous. This one, however, did not go back into the lake and is already in the taxidermist's freezer waiting to go on the wall.

Those who fished on Thursday learned the lesson of being prepared for the worst when venturing out onto a lake the size of Lake Winnipeg. With temps in the mid 30's to start the morning it seemed like the perfect day to spend out on the lake. The warm temps and rain the previous night had begun to turn the snow into slush, which was taxing on many of the snowmobiles and ATV's that made their way up to 7 miles out onto the lake to find fish. The beautiful morning transitioned into an afternoon blizzard and subsequent white out. More than one machine broke down out on the ice in an attempt to get back to shore. GPS technology was the key to getting back safely in the blinding snow. Cool heads and savy survival skills allowed everyone to return safely to shore with stories to tell and a new found respect for mother nature's fury.

Thursday's blizzard, which was accompanied by a substantial cold front, turned the fish to a negative mood, but brought a crisp, clear, sunny Friday morning. FM Walleyes Unlimited and WAAM members were spread out along the east shore of the lake as well as a few scattered places on the west shore. Fish were not cooperative, although they were there and a few were enticed to bite on Live Target Golden Shiners, Fin-Tech Jitt-R-Jigs and Northland Tackle Macho Minnows & Buckshot Spoons. Those having good luck were tipping the lures with salted shiners, live minnows or dabbing on Pro-Cure Ice Gel. Mike Kuklik and crew from Shaw TV, Winnpeg, accompanied one of the groups to film an episode of "Mike On Ice". The filming included an interview with both FM Walleyes Unlimited and WAAM members participating in the event and also shots of Curt Brewer's 25" and Seth Amundson's 24" greenbacks caught that morning. Not far away in another group, Jacob Denning was starting his trip out on a good note by icing a 29" beauty.

Friday evening kicked off the event with the Angler's Social at the Selkirk Inn & Conference Center. Participants met and talked fishing for some time before appetizers were served and introductions began. Roger Stearns shared some tips and tricks of fishing Live Target lures. Roger then presented WAAM members Todd Williamson & Mike Chanway with their 1st place plaques for the NAIFC tournament that had been held a few weeks earlier out on Lake Winnpeg. Todd and Mike also shared their suggestions for taking trophy greenbacks through the ice. The evening wrapped up with drawings for door prizes that were donated by the event's sponsors; Scheels All Sports, Northland Fishing Tackle, Fin-Tech Fishing Tackle, and Kopper's Live Target Lures. Two special drawings were held at the end of the night, including an entry into the Fall Classic in Pine Falls, MB donated by the WAAM club. The lucky winner was FM Walleyes Unlimited member Mike Dow. The other drawing was an entry into the Cormorant Fall Classic Tournament. This drawing was won by Todd Williamson.

Saturday morning found the group splitting up in search of fish. Many headed back to the east side of the lake in areas that had been fished the day before while still others made the drive an hour north to fish near Riverton, Manitoba. Success was scattered, although overall the fishing was better than it had been the prior two days with limits of fish being common in both areas. On the ice fish fries or barbequed burgers and brats could be found throughout the groups of anglers. Later that evening at the Angler's Social back in Selkirk awards were given for big fish of the day in both the FM Walleyes Unlimited and WAAM group. Congratulations to Jan Bass who's 29" walleye caught near Balsam Bay won him a custom built Chuck DeRemer ice rod donated by Chuck for this event. FM Walleyes Unlimited member Ryan Heyer went home with a beautiful laser engraved trophy and the Eric Mederhand carved walleye traveling trophy for his 28" fish caught with the group in Riverton. In addition to these trophies, Fin-Tech Fishing Tackle donated a rain suit and wind suit to be awarded to the two largest fish caught with Fin-Tech Tackle. Claude Provencal of WAAM caught the largest with a very nice 26 34" fish and Barry Chouinard was close behind with a 26 1/2" walleye.

Sunday morning brought an overcast sky and scattered rain. Many participants headed out onto the lake and found some success while still others packed up and headed back home. Be on the lookout for information regarding the 2012 Lake Winnipeg Ice Fishing Excursion. It is sure to be a great time, with great people and great fishing!




















Tips on Buying Fishing Boat Insurance

BoatU.S. Angler is a membership program that's part of the nation's largest association of recreational boaters whose mission is to protect the interests of boat-owning freshwater anglers. With that in mind, it recommends that anglers should ask these five questions when shopping for insurance for their fishing boats:

- 1. Do you need an "actual cash value" or "agreed value" policy? If you have a claim, actual cash value policies take depreciation into account when reimbursing for a loss. For example, if your 12-year-old bass boat is totaled, you will be reimbursed for its current market value. Actual cash value policies are generally the less expensive option. On the other hand, agreed value policies are more expensive, but pay for repairs or replacement up to the value stated on the policy except for a few specified items regardless of the age or condition of the boat or equipment.
- Is my fishing gear covered? Any fishing boat insurance policy should automatically include some type of coverage for expensive tackle. If the boat is trailerable and used in freshwater, you may find a policy that includes this coverage without any additional cost
- 3. What is the fine print on using towing services? Some fishing boat insurance policies include on-the-water towing or roadside assistance service. The problem is that when you need to call upon these non-emergency services such as an on-the-water gas delivery, a tow back to the launch ramp or roadside tow vehicle jumpstart it counts against you as an insurance claim. Find an insurance company that offers them but does not require you to file an insurance claim in order to use them. You shouldn't be penalized when taking advantage of these valuable services.
- 4. Where can I go? Unlike car insurance that is good for every state you drive in, most boat insurance policies have what's called "cruising areas," limiting where the policy is in force. Trailer your fishing boat outside those areas and you'll need to call your insurer for an "extension" to ensure coverage remains in effect. Find an insurance policy that doesn't put limits on where you can trailer your boat.
- 5. What about tournament coverage? If you fish tournaments, make sure you have the liability coverage required. What if you've paid your entry fee but miss the tournament due to a breakdown while trailering? Look for a policy that offers some type of reimbursement for your entry fee if trailering troubles or other covered losses prevent you from competing.

'Pre-Flight' Your Boat Trailer Before You Take Off for The Wild Blue Water

A properly maintained and loaded boat trailer makes getting to the water easier and safer. BoatU.S.Angler, part of BoatU.S., the largest recreational boating association in the United States, suggests a driveway "preflight check" before you head to the lake and offers these suggestions.

Loading your boat and trailer: Most trailer manufacturers recommend loading your boat with seven to eight percent of the total weight placed on the tongue. This helps prevent fishtailing and gives you good control on the road. But you also need to think about balance. If you are planning a long trip with sporting gear and camping equipment loaded inside your boat, distribute the items evenly so that tongue weight is still maintained but gear isn't piled up in one spot. It's also very important to make sure you do not exceed the trailer manufacturer's maximum weight limit.

Pre-departure trailer checks: Performing the following trailer checks will ensure your safety on the road and at the launch ramp.

- Before you hook up, check the radiator coolant, transmission and the engine oil levels in your tow vehicle. Any suspension issues must be addressed now. This is also the time to examine the hitch, receiver and safety devices.
- On level ground, couple the trailer to the tow vehicle and check the brakes on tow vehicle and trailer, trailer lights and turn signals Safety chains should be crossed, secured with beefy fasteners and not make contact with the pavement.
- Ensure that sideview mirrors allow you see a complete picture
 of the sides of the boat and trailer wheels. If not, get a pair of
 temporary towing mirrors.
- Walk around the trailer and towing vehicle looking for any problems such as damaged springs or chafed wiring. Inspect tires for tread wear, inflation and overall condition. Check your spare tires too.
- While at the tires, check the tightness of the trailer wheel lugs.
 Repeat this check periodically during your trip. Also ensure bearings are greased and dust caps in place.
- Be prepared for a potential roadside breakdown by ensuring any that tools, emergency equipment and foul-weather gear is readily accessible.
- Finally, check and inspect all bow, transom and gunwale tie-down straps.

Aquatic Nuisance Species

Make it Part of Your Routine Every Time You Leave the Water



Remove all aquatic plants from boats, trailers, fishing tackle and other equipment. Remove all aquatic plants from livewells and bait containers.



Drain all water from boats (including livewells) and other watercraft when leaving a water body. All boats coming in from other states must have all water drained before entering North Dakota.



Do not bring in live aquatic bait from another state, and do not release baitfish in any North Dakota water.
