Hello to everyone! My name is Wesley Erdle. I am a fisheries development technician stationed in the Bismarck field office. I was born in Dickinson and raised 25 miles east near Richardton on a family farm/ranch. At a very young age I fell in love with the outdoors and throughout my youth I hunted and fished as much as I possibly could get away from the ranch. I graduated from Richardton Taylor High School in 2001. After graduation there was no doubt in my mind what field I wanted to pursue in college. I attended North Dakota State University for four years and graduated in 2005 with a bachelor of science in Zoology with an emphasis in wildlife and fisheries management.

I started working for the department as a summer seasonal in 2004. I worked seasonally for a little over two years and in July of 2007 I was hired full time. The bulk of my job consists of the construction and maintenance of boat ramps and courtesy docks across the state.
