

Ample water and aggressive fish stocking produced numerous "new" walleye fisheries across North Dakota in the last decade. These new lakes are productive, and have provided fantastic fishing opportunities.

With an increase in walleye anglers, concerns by some regarding the potential for overharvest and requests for special regulations to cuttail beneat are more common. On many new waters, a minimum length limit to allow little fish to grow

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











