24th Annual Reel & Rec Derby

The Reel & Rec Walleye Derby will be held on May 14, 2005 at Graner Bottoms. Entrance fees are the same as last year at \$99.00 per team. The drawing will be held at the Mandan Moose Club on April 19, 2005 at 7:30pm. There will be a free keg of beer and a raffle and a good time will be had by all! The rules meeting will be held at the Bismarck Amvets on May 11, 2005 at 7:30pm. As you know, at least one member from each team must be in attendance.

There will be the traditional fish fry on Friday evening. Please bring walleye fillets. If you haven't experienced this you are in for a treat. Many a derby has been won by the information gotten during this event! A lot of the food is donated by Grand Forks Grocery and these veteran fryers know what they're doing.

The derby starts at 6:00am on Saturday, May 14, 2005 with a boat inspection. Remember that your boat, trailer, and live wells should be clean of any plant life and should have been cleaned thoroughly using a bleach mixture to eliminate aquatic nuisance species (ANS). The first flight leaves at 7:00am and must be reported in by 3:00pm. There will be four flights at fifteen-minute intervals. Once again, Reiny Keller and his expert crew will be in charge of live release, so take care of your fish!

ND Sports Fishing Congress



can't ignore.

The Walleye Pop & Cha Cha are floating lures that are extremely effective for catching active fish. But as we all know, the Dakota's have more than their share of weather front. And we all know what a front will do to the fishing. It generally causes lockjaw. The walleyes just lay on the bottom and refuse to chase bait. Ah, but I've found a way to trigger these guys too. I'll use a floating lure with a three foot leader of monofilament line from my main weight. Now I know you're saying, "that'll

ride too high", but I fine tune it depending on how tight the fish are to the bottom. If their tight-tight, I'll squeeze a split shot about six to eight inches from the lure. Use a shot just heavy enough to sink the lure slowly, sort of a buoyant. When you pull this by their nose, they can't resist.
