#### HOW TO "KILL" A FISH CLEANING STATION

This insight comes from Vern Davis of the Morton County Parks. The major component of a fish cleaning station is the grinder. The most common damage to the grinder is caused from fish hooks and fishing line, especially the "super" lines we use today, such as fireline. It is important to remove these from the fish carcass before it's put into the grinder.



## **BIS-MAN REEL & REC CLUB** 26TH ANNUAL WALLEYE DERBY **GRANER PARK** MAY 19, 2007

The Bis-Man Reel & Rec hosted their 26th Annual Walleye Derby May 19, 2007 at Graner Park in the Sugarloaf Bottoms south of Mandan. Seventy Six teams competed for a prize pool of \$7,680. The top eleven places and the team with the largest walleye received cash prizes.

In conjunction with our Main Walleye Derby, the participants were offered the option of entering a side tournament called The Boat Ramp & Special Projects (BRSP) Derby for \$2400. in additional prize money. Fifty three teams opted in to the Derby, with the top ten teams cashing a check.

The proceeds from the Main Derby go to our Take-a-Kid Fishing Program and the proceeds from the BRSP Derby are used for public projects in cooperation with the ND Game & Fish Department, Burleigh County, Morton County, and the cities of Bismarck & Mandan.

The Winners of the 26th Annual Walleye Derby, Aaron Franklund, Robert Bauer, Austin Bement, and the Champions of the Special Projects Derby, Brian Fettig, Matt Dietrich, and John Dietrich have carved their place in Reel & Rec history. Congratulation to all of you. I'm proud of you. The conditions were far from ideal, but you came through.

There were 423 Walleves weighed-in with a combined weight of 889.13 lbs., yielding a 2.10 average. On Sunday morning, 27 pounds of fresh Walleye filets donated by the Derby teams were delivered to the Ruth Meier's Hospitality House

If you didn't get a Derby cap or t-shirt and would like one, I've got 8 caps and 3 XL shirts left for purchase at \$5 each.

A huge thank you to the sponsors for your participation, your contribution, and your continuing support. We look forward to working with you again.

#### **FAMILY FISHING DAYS**

On Saturday, June 2nd the North Dakota Game and Fish Department is kicking off the 2007 fishing season by holding a family fishing day at the OWLS pond located at the Department Headquarters on E Bismarck Expressway. Hours will be from 10am until 5pm and there will be fishing rods and basic tackle available to check out free of charge. Each family will receive a container of bait to get them started and the first 100 kids 14 and under will also get a free gift. Between 12pm and 2pm we will be serving hot dogs and refreshments on a first come first served basis.

A pond enhancement project was recently completed that improved the fishery and greatly increased shoreline access. Spring netting indicated the pond had great winter fish survival. In addition, 600 Rainbow Trout and 150 catfish were recently stocked. Another load of Rainbow's are scheduled to be stocked, and if the fisheries division can find them, bluegill's and large mouth

Saturday, June 2nd also happens to be free fishing weekend so adults do not need a fishing license to participate. There are no bait restrictions, the pond is catch and release, and the area is handicapped accessible. It's important to note that while the area is located in town, the area is still fairly primitive. There is a picnic shelter and benches where you enter the site, but other than that there are no toilets, running water, fire rings, and very little shade around the pond. Parents are encouraged to bring water, sunscreen, and clothing to protect your family from the elements. Pets, glass bottles, or alcohol are not permitted on the OWLS.

This event also kicks off a new program we are offering to encourage parents and other adults to take a kid fishing. From June through August we are going to have fishing equipment available to check out on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9am-7pm. Parents be aware that while there will be adults in the area to answer questions, there will be little or no direct supervision. This is not a daycare program. If kids aren't old enough to get to the pond on their own, they need to have an adult with them. We simply want to provide a fishing opportunity for kids and families that's safe, close and you stand a great chance of catching a fish. The only thing they really need to bring on those days is bait. Worms seem to work best overall, but minnows, corn, artificial bait or any number of lures all work. We are trying out this program for the summer. If we get good response from the public, and enough volunteers to support the program, we will keep it going.

We also want to let the people know the OWLS pond is open to fishing year round during daylight hours. The site includes a 70 acre demonstration area with a walking trail that winds through several habitat areas which include native grass plantings, trees, and many wildlife viewing opportunities.

It's important to get the word out to families that fishing is a great family activity. It keeps kids off the street and gives them a break from all of the video games and other electronic gadgets. Kids who spend more time outdoors, particularly interacting with natural environments and less time in the virtual world receive better marks in school, have higher self esteem, and lower anxiety levels. We want to reach out to parents and let them know that fishing is fun, safe and requires very little expertise or equipment. You can catch fish from shore on a fishing pole bought at a rummage sale, with worms dug from the garden.

We are looking for volunteer's to assist with this program. It fits right into our existing Aquatic Education project, the main goal of which is to introduce kids to fishing. You don't need to be a professional fisherman or teacher to become an instructor, all that's needed is an interest in introducing our youth to fishing. Volunteer fishing instructors receive a hat, t-shirt, newsletter, invitation to a yearly banquet, access to fishing equipment and training aids, as well as recognition items for years of service. If you are over 18 and have an interest in teaching kids to fish, contact Jeff Long at 328-6322.

The Bis-Man Reel and Rec will hold it's 26th Annual "Take a Kid Fishing Day" on Saturday, June 9th, 2007 at Sweetbriar Dam located approximately 20 miles west of Bismarck along Interstate 94. Please fill out the form on the back and send it to the address listed below. This event is preferably for children under the age of 16 with the exception of physically or mentally challenged individuals.

There will be a medical volunteer such as a nurse or doctor to provide any medical attention that may be needed. Please fill out the medical information waiver and special information section on the attached application and send any special instructions on its administration.

Please have your child dress appropriately for the weather keeping in mind that it is generally cooler by the lake. Also, medications and instructions on its use should be sent with your child.

Children taking the bus need to be at the assembly areas in time for an 8:00 AM sharp departure! You may pick your children up at the same spot at approximately 3:00 PM.

All children must ride home on the same bus they rode out to the lake. NO EXCEPTIONS!

In case of inclement weather, please stay tuned to KFYR – AM 550 radio for any announcements.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

Children who do not have the means to go fishing.

Children of single parent families or parents who do not fish.

Children and parents who do not have the means to fish but would like to spend a memorable day fishing with their children.

Age preference for children should be under the age of 16. But anyone is welcomed.

Mentally or physically challenged participants, group home and special needs participants are exempt from the above age request.
