


Not only are we involved in our own youth programs, we take great pride in joining other Organizations to assist with their events, such as:

Missouri River Focus Group

On May 31, 2007 I attended a meeting at the ND Game & Fish Department to discuss safety concerns on the Missouri River in the immediate Bismarck-Mandan area. The meeting was facilitated by Mr. Robert Timian, Enforcement Officer for the ND G&F Dept. In attendance were Marina owners, Boat Dealership owners, riverfront landowners, the riverboat pilot, boat recreation enthusiasts, and fishermen.

The topics brought up:

- Riverfront landowners are upset at the large wakes being created that cause bank erosion and damage docks & boats.
- The riverboat has had many near misses with boat operators cutting in front of them or not yielding to them.
- Reckless operation of boats and personal watercraft.
- Boating under the influence.
- Operators not adhering to no wake areas (marinas, public boat ramps, etc.)
- Operators not adhering to no access areas (operating too close to shore fishermen, boat fishermen, docks, swimmers, non-powered craft, etc.)

The Missouri River is now being shared by the following individuals:

Fishermen Pontoons Kayaks & Canoes Water skiers

Speedboats Cuddy Cabins Jet-skis Tubers

Riverboat Wake Boarders Houseboats Swimmers



Safety is a huge issue in this area. There are 50,000 watercraft registered in ND and only 15,000 people have been certified in the Boat & Water Safety Course provided by the ND Game & Fish Dept. The rules on the water are very similar to the Rules of the Road when operating a motor vehicle. Without these you have chaos, much like a summer weekend on the Missouri River.

From the original meeting in May, a group was formed to meet monthly to address and discuss this situation. We last met August 29th and will recess until February when we will pick up where we left off and try to find some common ground with all the stakeholders.

The solution?? Mandatory licensing of watercraft operators?? No wake zone from Ft. Lincoln to the Refinery?? Mandatory Boat & Water Safety Certification?? Increased enforcement?? These suggestions have all been made by one group or another. I feel the majority of these problems can be solved with education. Many of these operators have no clue other than turn the key and go. The Bis-Man Reel & Rec Club will continue to work with Nancy Boldt of the ND Game & Fish Dept. in offering classes for voluntary Boat & Water Safety Certification. These classes last about two hours, and finish with an open book test that you can take home to complete. Please contact Nancy or Richard Fink (258-6181) with any questions.



Notice of By-Laws and Dues Increase

At the September 4, 2007 monthly meeting, the By-Laws for our Club were created. Up until this point we have operated under a Constitution only. Since our inception in April, 1980, many subjects have come up and motions passed by the Board of Directors. These were recorded in the meetings minutes, and now are incorporated into our By-Laws.

One topic in particular has been discussed since 1989, but never acted on. That is Categorizing Memberships and increasing Membership Annual Dues.

A Membership in the Bis-Man Reel & Rec Club has always been considered a Family Membership (Member, Spouse, and children under 16 years of age). Broadening our categories of Membership became necessary to accommodate other Membership status. We also raised the age of children covered under a Family Membership. New Membership categories are:

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

There shall be four (4) categories of Membership: **Individual:** An Individual Membership.

Family: A Family Membership will be issued in one name, and will include a

Spouse and all children under eighteen (18) years of age or younger.

Business: A Business Membership will include any for-profit enterprise.

Organization: Any group operating as a non-profit organization. Example: Fraternal

Organizations, Charities, Fishing Clubs, Youth Organizations, groups for the Aged, Poor, or Disabled, or any other group that promotes

goodwill and volunteerism.

Membership Dues have remained \$5.00 per year since our Club came into existence in April, 1980. To give you some perspective, gasoline was \$1.23 a gallon, and 1st class postage was 15 cents. There were two considerations for raising the Membership Dues: (1) To meet the costs of doing business, (2) To give your Membership added value. The new Membership Dues are:

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP DUES

Individual: Ten (\$10.00) dollars per year, Twenty Five (\$25.00) dollars for three (3) years. **Family:** Ten (\$10.00) dollars per year, Twenty Five (\$25.00) dollars for three (3) years.

Business, and Organization: Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars per year, Forty (\$40.00) dollars for three (3) years.

The new Membership Dues rates are effective January 1, 2008. There are several points that the Board specified and I want to make very clear to you:

All Membership Dues paid before January 1, 2008 are \$5.00 per year. You can use the Membership application in this newsletter to sign up for as long a period as you wish, at \$5.00 per year or a Life Membership for \$100.00.

If you are already paid up for multiple years: The new Dues rate will only affect you on your Dues due date printed above your name on your mailing label. You also have the option of extending your Membership by using the Membership application in this newsletter, at \$5.00 per year if paid by before January 1, 2008.

Memberships make nice gifts for friends & family. You may sign up a new member for as long a period as you wish, at \$5.00 per year, if paid before January 1, 2008.

Why Winterize Your Camper ???

As a service department, we see the results of not winterizing properly and most of the time it turns into an expensive and timely repair. We do want customers to winterize and do it before it gets real cold. We recommend using quality antifreeze available at your local RV parts dept. Cheaper brands from discount stores aren't the best and can stain your appliances. On an average, it takes about two gallons to winterize most campers.

Drain your fresh water tanks and black & gray tanks. Drain water heater tank. You won't get all of the water out, but will get the majority of it. Bypass the hot water heater by shutting off water inlet (cold) and shutting off water outlet (hot), then open bypass valve so antifreeze can move thru the lines. Locate your water pump and remove inlet side hose. Attach a jumper hose on this side with the other end into the antifreeze. After turning on the water pump, start at one of the faucets. Turn the cold side on until water output turns pink, and then close. Repeat with the hot side. Go on to the other faucets, bathtub, kitchen, bathroom faucets, outside shower, and toilet. I always leave a little antifreeze in the toilet to keep valve seals soft. Running antifreeze thru the lines and down the drains will protect your water pipes. We also like to disconnect shower heads and drain the water from them. After you've completed the steps above, shut off the water pump and disconnect the jumper hose. Reattach the inlet line and tighten. You can also reverse your water heater bypass procedure and put the water heater plug back in. Last, but not least, the fresh water hose connection will have water trapped in it. Remove cap & screen, and with your thumb push in on the small plunger. Be prepared for a little back spray. Reinstall cap & screen. You're now ready for a safe storage and come spring all you'll need to do is fill water, flush the system, and go camping.
